LEARNING GOALS

You will learn the core skills needed to train all concepts and then teach your animal his or her first complete concept skill: match to sample! This course is required before taking any of the other courses in our Concept **Training family** of courses.



Upon completing the course, you will be able to:

- 1. Define concept training
- 2. Describe several types of concept training
- 3. Describe what kind of training needs to take place before concept training
- 4. Understand the impactful role a marker, such as a clicker, can play in conveying information to the learner effectively and precisely
- 5. Understand the importance of establishing solid basics in regard to criteria, focus, and cue fluency
- 6. Understand the roles that fading a cue, a station position, and different types of targeting can play in concept training
- 7. Understand why critical skills are important to success in concept training
- 8. Practice key critical skills from daily training that are used in concept training:
 - a. Stationing
 - b. Targeting
 - c. Desensitization
 - d. Generalization
 - e. Fluency
- 9. Describe what "training for the rule" means, and its importance to concept training
- 10. Engage in exercises that will build readiness for learning. These skills require the animal to learn an idea, a concept, or a set of rules to apply under given circumstances

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- 11. Train five skills:
 - a. Fading a cue
 - b. Free shaping
 - c. 101 things to do with an object
 - d. Release signal
 - e. Matching to sample
- 12. Understand the different types of concept training that will be covered in upcoming KPA courses
- 13. Understand what will be learned in each course and an explanation of the prerequisites needed for that course
- 14. Understand how interest, time, and skill sets play key roles in concept-training success
- 15. Consider the impact concept training can have on your current training and behavior repertoire
- 16. Understand how acquired conceptual skills can enhance your learner's problem-solving abilities so that the animal can take on new concepts and become a consummate problem-solver more quickly
- 17. Understand how to recognize the influence concept training has on the bond you have with your dog
