## LEARNING GOALS

You will learn to set up and maintain a complete in-shelter training and enrichment program for dogs and cats that will increase enrichment and reduce stress.



- 1. Build relationships among shelters and trainers
- 2. Overcome common challenges to setting up a shelter training program, such as time, money, and space
- 3. What clicker training is, how and why it works, and how to use it effectively with your own dog at home (or a borrowed dog)
- 4. Get behavior started: capturing, targeting, and shaping, using your own dog at home
- 5. Train with a marker and reinforcers, without the need for corrections
- 6. Select appropriate cues and add cues to behaviors you teach
- 7. Read canine body language accurately, including signs of happiness, stress, and aggression
- 8. Recognize stress in both dogs and cats within a shelter environment
- Train behaviors that will help make shelter animals more adoptable, reduce their stress, and improve their quality of life
- 10. Reduce the level of barking in a kennel
- 11. Maximize limited space for a shelter training program
- 12. Organize training volunteers and keep them motivated
- 13. Set up, acquire the materials for, and maintain an enrichment program in a shelter
- 14. Enrich all five senses of shelter animals in your care
- 15. Offer food enrichment, social contact, toys, and exercise/play for shelter dogs and cats at a low cost
- Identify and help solve some behavior issues commonly seen in shelters
- 17. Identify and address special needs of shelter puppies
